General Camping Policies

Pinnacle Lake Estates camping areas are here for your enjoyment. Remember...take only pictures and leave only footprints.

Common Grounds

- Use of any of the Pinnacle Lake Estates “Common Grounds” are at your own risk.
- Common grounds are for the use of all Association members in “good standing” and their guests.
- Guest Campers are ONLY allowed with advanced notice AND approval of the Board of Trustees.
- It is your responsibility to keep these areas clean.
- An adult lot owner must supervise all picnics and/or parties on common grounds.
- Camping is on a temporary basis only. No permanent camping is allowed

Campfires

- Help us protect our trees by preventing the spread of harmful insect pests to Pinnacle Lake Estates. Please do not bring firewood with you into our lake areas.
- Campfires and open fires may be banned in selected campgrounds during extremely dry conditions. Please contact the PLE office immediately prior to your visit for fire status. Charcoal fires in grills are permitted during bans unless otherwise noted.
- No unattended fires at any time.
- Where fires are permitted, use established fire rings.
- Keep fires small.
- Burn all wood and coals to ash, put out campfires completely, then scatter cool ashes.
- No fires are allowed on the Pinnacle.

Dog Policy

Pinnacle Lake Estates is pleased to welcome you and your dog to enjoy the great outdoors together. While at PLE a dog may pose a real danger to wildlife and may disturb other visitors. In order to help keep our parks open to dogs, responsible ownership is the key.

- All dogs must adhere to the appropriate licensing and vaccination requirements.
- While at PLE, your dog must be under your supervision and control at all times.
- Honor all park signs that prohibit the entry of dogs in specific areas.

- Guide dogs are permitted in all pedestrian areas.
- You must clean up after your pet.
- Never leave dogs unattended, even in your vehicle or camper. This is especially true in the summer, when the inside temperature of vehicles can become life-threatening. PLE security officers may need to notify authorities in order to rescue an animal in distress in a vehicle.

Dispose of Waste Properly

- Pack it in, pack it out. Inspect your campsite and rest areas for trash or spilled foods. Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter

Leave What You Find

- Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects as you find them.
- Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Do not deface or destroy any nature areas on the Pinnacle Rock.

Respect Wildlife

- Observe wildlife from a distance. Do not follow or approach them.
- Never feed animals. Feeding wildlife damages their health, alters natural behaviors, and exposes them to predators and other dangers.
- Protect wildlife and your food by storing rations and trash securely.
- Control pets at all times, or leave them at home.
- Avoid wildlife during sensitive times: mating, nesting, raising young, or winter.

Be Considerate of Other Campers

- Respect other visitors and protect the quality of their experience.
- Be courteous. Yield to other users on narrow roads.
- Let nature's sounds prevail. Avoid loud voices and noises.
